Rewards

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Whole Class:

The class can earn points when everyone is 'doing the right thing', for example lining up, participating in lessons, showing best behaviour in assembly. They will then earn a variety of treats when collect the required number of points. E.g. 15 points = extra play, 30 points = curling, 75 points = film and popcorn etc

Individual:

Children can earn 'raffle tickets' when demonstrating good behaviour, for example being kind to others, showing good manners, showing a positive attitude in lessons. One ticket is then drawn each week during Celebration Assembly and the winner from each class receives a certificate and meets with Mr Lord for a drink and cake.

Every fortnight a child per class is celebrated for 'Best Work in Class', this is to reward their efforts for trying their best in lessons. Children receive raffle tickets and a certificate in assembly for this.
